Larry Strange has served as Executive Director of the Cambodia Development Resource Institute since December 2003. He also serves as a regular commentator, presenter and participant in national and regional forums on socio-economic development issues in Cambodia, the Greater Mekong Sub-region, ASEAN and the broader Asian region. He is co-author of CDRI's Cambodia country background paper for the ADBI-ADB study *ASEAN 2030: Growing Together for Shared Prosperity*.

Prior to taking up his current position at CDRI, Larry Strange was the Director of Asia Australia Institute at the University of New South Wales in Sydney, Australia for ten years, working on issues pertaining to Asian regionalism, major political, economic and social trends in East Asia, and their impact on Australian foreign policy.

His educational background is in Asian history and politics, specializing on Southeast Asia and India, law, and international relations. He has special research and policy interests in East Asian regional integration and the political discourse of national identity in response to regionalism and sub-regionalism, and in the impact of international development assistance policy and practice on developing countries in the Asian region.
