Xiaoming Huang is Professor of International Relations at the Victoria University of Wellington, New Zealand, and Director of the New Zealand Contemporary China Research Centre.

Professor Huang received his PhD in International Relations from the University of Southern California, Los Angeles, and BA and MA in International Relations from Peking University. Prior to joining Victoria University of Wellington in 1997, Professor Huang was a research/teaching fellow at the East-West Center in Honolulu; the United Nations University in Tokyo; the Woodrow Wilson Center for International Scholars in Washington, DC; Pacific Council on International Policy in Los Angeles; University of Tampere in Finland; University of Trondheim in Norway; and, University of Pittsburgh.

Professor Huang is editor of *International Studies Perspectives*; an Honorary Research Professor of the University of International Business and Economics (Beijing); an Honorary Research Professor of China University of Political Science and Law (Beijing); a Senior Research Fellow of the Research Institute of Economic Thoughts and Economic History of Fudan University (Shanghai); and a Member of the International Advisory Board of Fudan University Contemporary China Research Centre (Shanghai). Dr Huang is a principal participant and contributor to the New Zealand public policy sector, particularly on China and Asia policy and issues, and has been a New Zealand delegate in bilateral Track II dialogues with China, Korea, Taiwan, Japan, India, Myanmar, Australia, Malaysia, and ASEAN, and a member of CSCAP: New Zealand National Council.

Dr. Huang is a leading scholar on East Asia's political economy and international relations, as well as the modern development of China. His publications appeared in *International Studies Quarterly*, *Journal of International Relations and Development*, *Journal of the Asia-Pacific Economy*, etc. His publications include *Strong Market and Weakening State: The Political Economy Transition in East Asia*; *The Rise and Fall of the East Asian Growth System 1951-2000: Institutional Competitiveness and Rapid Economic Growth*; *The Institutional Dynamics of China's Great Transformation*; *China, India and the End of Development Models*; *China and the International System*; *Modern Economic Development in Japan and China: Developmentalism, Capitalism, and the World Economic System*.
